The Bay School's 2008 Distinguished Lecturer series will feature noted researcher and author Dr. Raymond Miltenberger, Ph.D., presenting a talk entitled "**Using Applied Behavior Analysis to Teach Safety Skills** "

Dr. Miltenberger's presentation will summarize his work on teaching a variety of safety skills, including abduction prevention, gun safety, fire safety, and abuse prevention to children and adults with and without a variety of disabilities, including autism. Dr. Miltenberger's talk will highlight some of the critical factors to consider when teaching these important skills.

Dr. Miltenberger is currently a professor at the University of South Florida. He is also the Director of the Master's Program in Applied Behavior Analysis. He has published over 125 journal articles and 25 chapters, has co-edited a text on analysis and treatment of tics and repetitive behavior disorders, and has written a behavior modification textbook, now in its fourth edition. Dr. Miltenberger has received a number of awards for his teaching and research.

Dr. Miltenberger's presentation is part of The Bay School's Distinguished Lecturer Series, a series of free talks open to the public designed to inform the community about the latest treatment findings related to autism.
